- Ideas for growing engagement:
  - Highlighting member experiences with stories and photos

  - Set meeting dates one year in advance

      - One option: Burnout prevention & healing, Nima **Novak, M.S., CCC-SLP** "The effects of vicarious trauma have been shown in research to cause very harmful consequences to those experiencing them. In this 2-hour training, the presentation will include: definitions; research on how polyvagal theory can help prevent vicarious trauma; an introduction to the neuroscience of nervous system and brain chemicals; and strategies caregivers of system involved youth (who are all too often negatively affected by vicarious trauma) can implement. Participants will be guided through a sequence of learning activities to explore and understand the negative impact that vicarious trauma can have on system involved youth and families and to gain increased self-awareness in order to reduce harm in the future through nervous system regulation and self-examination of their own behavior. Learning activities will include: self-reflection, storytelling of real life examples, large group exercises, and participant question time."

- Mock Pura Belpre
  - Looking for members to plan a mock for fall 2024
  - Possible to collaborate with Childrens' Services Division and do a co-mock with their Caldecott/Newberry mock
  - Brandace will reach out to <u>Duncan Tonatiuh</u> for quotes for in-person vs virtual keynote
  - Could we host it in Woodburn?
- Communications
- Libros for Oregon
  - Costs of shipping have gone up, they are with the best vendor but looking for opportunities for funding
  - Will have a poster at OLA conference
  - Looking to lower participation barriers
  - More refinement needed for application process--working with new vendors for price points
  - Multicultural Books increased prices significantly (40% cost for shipping and handling)
  - Latin American Book Source is no longer in business
  - What are the current needs of this committee and how do we connect that with the larger needs and mission of REFORMA Oregon?
  - REFORMA Oregon President is attending Libros meetings, have Libros leadership attend REFORMA Oregon meetings--build better support
  - How do we celebrate Libros on a national level, give recognition for work accomplished and help other states start their own projects?
  - Libros was started initially with the idea to share how to incorporate FIL into regular library collection development

#### **MEMBER UPDATES 11:40 - 12:55**

- Martin, Hillsboro, many more patrons that need help, librarians are becoming more like social workers, English as a second language classes with Goodwill, program with PSU to work with autistic kids, need for security support, lack of resources, library staff is afraid and stressed, going to have a community fair
- Sarah, Eugene, more and more mental health situations with patrons,
- Allison, Woodburn, new bookmobile, partnering with Salem organization to offer GED in Spanish classes, partner with Goodwill to offer ESL classes, partnering with SOAR for other test prep classes, it takes time to build relationships with partner organizations
- Felishia, got Libros for Oregon books delivered, have internal Latinx engagement community that is doing great work especially in advocating for translation including on the website, have a stipend for staff that speaks Spanish and contract with some translators, but there are some gaps, too much work to put on the Spanish speaking staff to be in charge of all translations
- Greta, State Library of Oregon, Diversity Equity and Inclusion Consultant position open at the State Library, there are some teen internship opportunities
- Kristen, Springfield, recommends checking out events hosted by and reaching out to <u>Comunidad y Herencia Cultural</u>, <u>Eugene Arte Latino</u>, or hosting an author/book event for <u>Los Origenes Hispanos de Oregon</u>. Springfield collaborates on many cultural events throughout the year with these organizations, Grupo de Lectura has featured local author events in addition to Spanish language book club
- Jenn, Tillamook, partnered with local health authority for handing out books and library information, will be posting an opening for a Spanish speaking programming librarian
- Adriana, Madras/Jefferson County, 1/3 Latinx, 1/3 anglo, 1/3 indigenous population, Spanish/family storytime, book club for adults, 4th year with the book club (bought t-shirts with a grant with special book club logo), provide storytimes in the schools, March 9 author visit (Luci Escobar) with workshop for Latinx community that includes food, Radio Poder is community collaboration, had presentation of Los Origines Hispanos de Oregon, self care workshop in Spanish, Friday night movies
- Elide McMinnville, Working on a DIA celebration that would be a resource fair/activities/vendors for a full fun day at the library, working on getting Spanish translation for the website, summer programs are partnered with Parks and Rec with the idea that there should be one bilingual person at each event, in the fall Read and Dine program for Hispanic Heritage Month (read Latinx author, enter in raffle to get a gift card at Latinx restaurant), Día de los muertos with community groups and opportunity to learn about ofrendas and host ofrendas
- Star, over 500 for Día de los muertos event (¼ of population!), community workshop for families (73 people) that focused on wellness with art therapy (came from Mexico; Corazon Utilitarian Handcrafts), Día de los niños carnival

- with Connexion Fenix (non profit that Star started with a community member after the fire), did her first radio show "Hanging with the Oregon Homies"
- Brandace, capital projects, new branch open, renovations in rural branches including meeting space that will include a teaching kitchen, library foundation raised funds to purchase property for new Grants Pass library, \$250,000 check presented to library from the Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe, Noche en Comunidad (library, Project Youth Plus, school and health equity organization) once a month Spanish parent group that also has programming at each event, some residents are trying to opt out of library district, follow for statewide implications
